
Subject: International Student AP 5012 Revision Date: 5/3/16

Whereas: International Students should have the liberty to choose their own insurance policy and have reasonable payment options while still meeting State and Federal requirements for F-1 Student enrollment.

Whereas: Associated Students recognize that AP 5012 does not clearly define Mt. SAC Insurance approval process nor possess sufficient information or guidelines to do so. AP 5012 should be revised to provide more options and transparency on the insurance company approval process. International Students come from diverse backgrounds and religions, thus requiring different medical practices that may not be provided by one insurance company.

Whereas: International Students are required to contract with only Student Insurance as their option (as per the July Board of Trustee meeting; Contract with Student Insurance to Provide Health Insurance for International Students, consented to July 8 2015). The contract with Student Insurance expires August 3rd, 2016 and should be revised to address student needs and concerns.


Therefore: Be it resolved, that the A.S. Senate, the A.S. Executive Board, and the A.S. President render support for International Students AP 5012 Revision.

Chapter 5 - Student Services

AP 5012 International Students

References:

Education Code Sections 76140, 76141, and 76142; Title 5 Section 54045; Title 8 U.S.C. Sections 1101 et seq.

International Student Admission and Enrollment Requirements

A. Mt. San Antonio College may issue a Certificate of Eligibility for Nonimmigrant Student Status I-20 to an international student to obtain a Student Academic Visa (F-1) after the student has:

- completed a Mt. SAC Application for Admission;
- completed an International Student Application;
- paid an application processing fee;
- provided confidential financial support documentation;
- provided a passing score on the TOEFL examination (450 paper-based, 133 computer-based, or 45 internet-based), or a passing score on the IELTS (4.5 or higher), or completion of the 5th level of the CPELI curriculum from Cal Poly Pomona;
- provided proof of current medical insurance from an approved company;
- provided academic transcripts from high school and/or college; and
- provided a TB (Tuberculosis) skin test that is dated within the last six months. If the test result of the skin test is positive, the student is required to provide a current chest X-ray. If the chest X-ray is negative, the student is required to get a current (within the last six months) TB symptom review. If during the review, the applicant is found to be asymptomatic or TB-free, the student will be admitted. If the student has both a positive skin test and a positive chest X-ray, they will be denied admission.

B. F-1 Visa students already attending a U. S. institution of higher education may apply for admission to Mt. San Antonio College for F-1 student status and be issued an I-20 provided the following criteria are met:

1. must have attended an accredited college or university as a full-time student, completing at least 12 units of course work per semester;
2. must have maintained an overall grade point average of at least 2.0;

3. must provide a letter from a previous institution indicating that items one and two above were satisfied; and
 4. must provide a copy of the student's I-20 and their Arrival and Departure Record (I-94).
- C. Mt. San Antonio College may admit part-time (F-1 visa) international students to the College provided the I-20 issuing institution of higher education submits a formal authorization allowing concurrent enrollment at Mt. San Antonio College.
- D. Mt. San Antonio College may admit to the College, on a part-time basis, individuals who have valid United States visas, provided the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) allows persons with their particular visa classification to attend school.
- E. International F-1 Visa students must complete the International Students Orientation prior to enrollment.

Economic Hardship Exemption

Per California Education Code Section 76142, any prospective international student who possesses an economic hardship is exempt from paying the international student application fee. Economic hardship, in this instance, refers to the prospective student's and/or his/her family's ability to pay for the application fee by proving a prior year income (adjusted to U. S. dollars) of \$80,000 or less. Students qualifying under Education Code Section 76140 who are exempt from paying nonresident tuition, are also exempt from paying the international student application fee.

SUBJECT: <u>Contract with Student Insurance to Provide Health Insurance for International Students</u>	

BACKGROUND

As a condition of their acceptance to Mt. San Antonio College, International F-1 visa students must provide proof of financial ability which includes the ability to pay for tuition, fees, living expenses, expenses of dependents (if any), proof of medical insurance, and any other designated or unforeseen expenses to cover an academic year of 12 months. Approval is requested to contract with Student Insurance to provide health insurance coverage for the College's International F-1 visa students. With approval of this agreement, all International F-1 visa students are expected to purchase their health insurance through Student Insurance, unless other exceptions for coverage have been approved.

ANALYSIS AND FISCAL IMPACT

The Student Accident and Sickness Insurance plan is for the period August 4, 2015, through August 3, 2016, and includes the following premiums and coverage limits:
